- o Rugby Canada National Growth Plan
  - Launched in 2025 the strategy is focussed on building strong pathways and build meaningful community for lifelong belonging
  - 5 key areas
    - Athlete development pathway → pathway for all
      - Without coaches, match officials, club executives, volunteers this sport is not successful
      - o How do we create this for all
    - Developing and ownership of non-contact rugby
      - Expand opportunities
    - Focus on youth development/school engagement
    - Continue to invest in women & girls to accelerate the women's game
    - Build capacity among provinces and clubs
      - Winter slows down the sport
  - Work that needs to continue

- o 2025-26 Canadian Rugby Championships
  - U19 Canadian Rugby Championships, July 2025 in Calgary Rugby Park
    - Men and Women
  - Submitted a bid to Rugby Canada and were successful
  - Questions/Comments
    - Danielle Weran: "Dates?"
      - Chris Cooke: July 20-27, more details to come once finalized
    - Kristen Schindel: "How can you provide more transparent information in people who are interested in rugby across the province?"
      - Chris Cooke: Provide more support and clubs in rural areas. Clear and transparent communication
    - Stephen Saunders: "One thing I always find the struggle is for communication is what amount of communication is right and where. From a club standpoint, we find the same challenges Kristen."
      - o Chris Cooke: Finding the key balance between communicating and overcommunicating.
- Director of Finance/Administration Report Darren Andruko
  - o Big year of investment Spent money to promote our sport
    - Subsidized cost of programs of all clubs and events to keep costs down
    - Marketing program
    - Purchase new radios for officials, streaming equipment
  - o 81K more than 63K budget to subsidized programs for players
    - Keep cost down
    - Revenues lower than expected (teams dropping out last minute)
  - Non-program related costs (keeping the lights on): 350K/year
    - 600K in cash at year end
    - Strong financial position
  - Successful audit by Metrics group
  - Questions/Comments:
    - Stephen Saunders: "What portion of the player program expenses were senior?"
      - Darren Andruko: Breakdown after the meeting, take this for a follow up
    - Luke Demeter: "Further to the comments about communication raised earlier by Kristen...A tactical example on that theme: Rugby Alberta's YDO resources are out in the community introducing rugby intro schools etc. We see the metrics

afterwards which is great but we (clubs, sub unions) generally don't know about these activities in advance in order to amplify the message and support the efforts.

If the ultimate goal is to attach ppl to clubs in local communities, we are missing an opportunity to provide the best "first impressions " to newcomers to our sport by not being aligned with RA, sub unions and local clubs."

- Chris Cooke: Making sure communicating in advance, proactively
- Danielle Weran "what were the expenses associated with sr men north vs south? 23k seems high for the series within alberta?"
  - Chris Cooke: Follow up item to provide more information after the meeting. Takes resources to run events (practice times, kit) and keeping costs as low as possible

  - ERU Dave Logan
    - Increased collaboration between CRU and ERU
    - Referees increase
    - Focus on representative programs
    - Strategic Plans
  - CRU Peter Rowe
    - Communications improving between sub unions
    - Rugby registrations improved in Southern AB
    - Height of registration: 2015
    - Improving grassroots and investing in meaningful rugby
  - AJRA Ultan Peters
    - Improve communications
    - Volunteer organization
    - Stepping down due to personal reasons, president and treasurer positions will be open
    - New Instagram! <u>https://www.instagram.com/albertajrugbyassociation/</u>
  - RAMOA Andrew Petti
    - Massive increase in officials officiating matches (~1670 total)
    - More tournaments
      - 38% increase in games
    - Better in putting games in SportLomo
    - 96 match officials registered
      - 81 of them did a match



- Northern Alberta registrations increased
  - Dave Logan: "ERU went from 22 to 33 referee registrations give or take."
- Will be sending a report for distribution later
- 2019: 103 match officials (peak), working to get back to that number – but we did officiate more games this year!
- 3 courses in the province: 27 officials went through it
  - Discussions about trying to bring more courses into rural Alberta (Grande Prairie, Lethbridge, Red Deer)
- Questions/Comments:
  - Erika Green (Red Deer Titans): "Red deer would LOVE a reffing course. I think we just don't know when or that it is an option to advertise it."

  - Executive Director & Director of Rugby Operations Report Sandy Nesbitt presented
    - Rugby Alberta programs have experienced remarkable growth (nearly doubling in size in the last year)
    - ARC 7s doubled to 2 weeks, 16 teams compete. Men/women competitions overlap with university competitions to encourage participation, improve engagement, and inspire young athletes
    - o 800 participants in Lethbridge area
    - o New areas: County Warriors, Big Storm
    - o North vs South AB: 3 events with men and women
    - Blue card pilot program
    - o Age grade Wolf Pack programs U16 and U18 Prairie Cup
      - U16 girls went to BC as other provinces dropped out
    - o Membership growth: 11%
    - o Communications: great strides but not as fast as we would like
    - o 2025 Calendar: CSG will be added, hosting CRCs
